### Pastor's Message

#### What is the meaning of life and death?

The trees in front of the Rectory are shedding their leaves. The trees that once had green leaves are now empty of leaves. The leaves are dead. But the trees remain. The days are getting shorter and it gets dark early. The fall season begins with fascinating and beautiful colours but then slowly we begin to witness the shedding of the leaves. This, too, speaks about our human live and existence: the beauty, the things that remain and ultimately the things that will be shed. Death comes but the soul endures. This body will one day die but the essence of who we are remains.

We are gradually coming to the end of the liturgical season. The Scriptures speak to us about the end, the coming of Jesus, the rising from death - some rising to everlasting life and others to shame and everlasting contempt.

We are invited to be vigilant: to reflect always about what matters, what is most important in life. What on earth am I here for? What is my purpose? What legacy am I going to leave? What is it about my life that will endure?

Staying by the bedside of people when they are dying, what they say at the end is often very profound. They think: 'These are my last words on this side of eternity.' People talk about purpose, relationships, love: stuff that really matters. Not a single person says, "Bring me my trophies: I want to see my golf trophies. Bring me my diploma, I want to look at it one more time. Bring me my gold watch." When people are dying, they want people around them. They want relationship. Eventually, we learn it's about love.

Pope Francis in his latest encyclical Dilexit Nos (He loved Us) aid:

"Instead of running after superficial satisfactions, we would do better to think about the really important questions in life:

- Who am I, really?
- What am I looking for?
- What direction do I want to give to my life, my decisions and my actions?
- Why and for what purpose am I in this world?
- How do I want to look back on my life once it ends?
- What meaning do I want to give to all my experiences?
- Who do I want to be for others?
- Who am I for God?"

These two important celebrations are often obscured by the commercialization of Hallowed Eve, other wise known as Halloween, which like Christmas Eve, is meant to prepare us for All Saints Day. All Saints Day celebrates our journey as a people of faith in becoming saints

We are all called to be saints in the small ways we live our faith everyday so that we can one day attain heaven. All Souls Day is a day for praying for those who have died, are in purgatory and are needing our prayers so that they may one day enter heaven.


